KPMG's EU Citizens Survey – How does this impact you or your clients?

Over the summer months, KPMG asked 2,000 EU nationals in the UK how Brexit might affect their decision to stay here or leave. Our survey also questioned 1,000 citizens inside the wider EU to understand what Brexit might mean for future immigration flows. The results have a direct impact on the future of Britain's workforce. Our survey found:

- An almost even split between those committed to staying and others thinking of leaving. Whether the UK experiences a large-scale loss of its EU workforce remains in the balance.
- Younger, better qualified and higher-paid people are more likely to be thinking about leaving – risking a 'brain drain' of top talent.
- A perception that British society has changed is the main reason people are thinking about leaving. Half of those surveyed in the UK said they felt less valued and welcomed here.
- EU citizens want employers to show more solidarity and offer more moral support.
