Healthcare regulatory news

CMS announced over <u>80M individuals are enrolled in Medicaid and</u> <u>CHIP</u>; 9.9M enrolled between February 2020-January 2021... CMS announced <u>\$20M in state-based marketplace support funding</u>.

HHS <u>withdrew an advisory opinion</u> requiring drug <u>manufacturers to</u> <u>provide 340B discounts</u> to contract pharmacies; however, enforcement against companies could continue... Biden Administration <u>appointed members to the 340B Administrative Dispute Resolution</u> <u>Board</u>.

FDA approved the <u>first oral blood thinner for children</u>... FDA statisticians <u>opposed approval of Biogen's Alzheimer's drug</u>, Aduhelm... FDA granted <u>breakthrough therapy designation</u> to Biogen and Eisai's Alzheimer's therapy... Eli Lilly will <u>seek accelerated approval</u> of its Alzheimer's drug.

<u>HHS-OPM-Treasury-Labor are seeking employer/insurer input</u> on implementing prescription drug-reporting requirements.

OIG <u>reported on hospital internet-of-things cybersecurity</u> risks... FCC posted <u>Connected Care Pilot Program guidelines</u> and announced 36 qualifying projects.





Healthcare law and policy news

Senate <u>confirmed ASPR and SAMHSA Directors</u>... President Biden nominated <u>Christi Grimm as HHS Inspector General</u>.

CMS revoked Indiana and Arizona Medicaid work requirements.

Supreme Court declined to hear an <u>Abbvie case over whether it</u> <u>violated antitrust law</u> by suing to block Androgel generic competition; an <u>Amarin bid to revive Vascepa patents</u>; and a <u>case from insurers</u> seeking <u>reimbursement for unpaid ACA cost-sharing subsidies</u>.

A Missouri judge ruled a voter-approved <u>measure to expand Medicaid</u> <u>was unconstitutional</u> because expansion lacked a funding source. Biogen <u>may adjust the price</u> of Aduhelm after launch, depending on patient uptake... Teva <u>will pay Mississippi \$925,000</u> to settle generic drug price-fixing charges.

LifePoint Health <u>will acquire Kindred Healthcare</u> and invest \$1.5B... Pear Therapeutics <u>will go public</u> through a \$1.6B SPAC... Health Catalyst <u>will acquire Twistle</u> (\$104.5M)... Amazon <u>launched</u> its <u>AWS</u> <u>digital health accelerator</u>... Blues plans launched a <u>startup to lower</u> <u>drugs costs through outcomes-based contracts</u> with manufacturers.

A <u>JAMA study found</u> 46% of the 250 highest spend Medicare Part D drugs in 2016 (33% of total spend) did not have cost-effectiveness analyses... KFF reported <u>51% of private insurance emergency ground</u> <u>ambulance rides</u> result in "surprise" out-of-network charges ... A study found that <u>23.7% of hospitals were fully compliant with price</u> <u>transparency requirements</u> in January/February.

Senate Finance Chair <u>Ron Wyden released principles for drug pricing</u> <u>reform legislation</u>... <u>Cures 2.0 legislation</u>, including a \$6.5B agency to speed breakthrough therapies, was <u>circulated</u> by House sponsors.
