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#### Special Supplement: COVID-19 News

In light of the continuing daily volume of COVID-19 activity and news, we have summarized <u>COVID-19 news for the week in this special supplement</u>.

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Healthcare regulatory news

CMS finalized CY2022 payment increases for <u>SNFs (1.2%)</u>, <u>hospice (2%)</u>, <u>inpatient rehabilitation facilities (1.5%)</u>, and <u>inpatient psychiatric facilities</u> (0.1%).

Biden Administration <u>proposed a "Buy American" rule to boost production</u> and give <u>price preferences to domestic products</u>, including active pharmaceutical products.

HHS <u>reversed a Trump Administration policy</u> limiting nursing home safety violation penalties.

CMS guidance states that <u>consumers will receive advanced premium tax</u> <u>credits</u> even if they did not file tax returns and reconcile 2020/2021 subsidies... IRS <u>guidance said that employees eligible</u> for free COBRA coverage under the American Rescue Plan are still eligible even if they initially opted out... CMS reported <u>average CY2022 basic Part D premiums</u> will <u>increase 4.9% to \$33</u>.

FDA approved the <u>first interchangeable biosimilar insulin product</u> and an <u>Abbvie pediatric bacterial skin infection treatment</u>.

GAO reported that <u>4.6% of 2017 Medicare Advantage enrollees switched to</u> <u>traditional Medicare</u> in their last year of life.

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Healthcare law and policy news

Senate <u>advanced debate on a bipartisan infrastructure bill</u>, which would delay the Medicare drug rebate rule and <u>extend the sequester</u> to help offset costs.

Anthem and <u>Humana invested \$140M</u> to launch a new PBM... Highmark <u>launched Lumevity</u> to support healthcare companies' organizational and digital transformation... Highmark is <u>collaborating with Stellar Health</u> on value-based payment transformation... Amwell will <u>acquire two digital</u> <u>health companies (\$32M)</u>... PathAI <u>acquired Poplar</u>... PerkinElmer <u>will</u> <u>acquire BioLegend (\$5.25B)</u>.

American Heart Association <u>called for more diversity in genomic studies</u> assessing cardiovascular risk... STAT reported that <u>AI algorithms</u> <u>developed by Epic provide inaccurate or irrelevant</u> information to hospitals about patients.

Endo International will <u>settle a Tennessee lawsuit (\$35M)</u> over opioidrelated claims... Purdue Pharma's creditors <u>endorsed the company's</u> <u>bankruptcy plan</u>... Humana <u>sued Regeneron over allegedly inflating</u> the Eylea's price.

UnitedHealthcare, Cigna, and Aetna announced <u>policies to restrict use of</u> <u>high-cost biologic drugs</u>.

Hospitals <u>sued HHS over the methodology</u> for <u>calculating graduate medical</u> <u>education reimbursement</u>.

Commonwealth Fund reported 10% of American adults were uninsured in the first half of 2021, down 12.5% from 2020... A <u>JAMA study concluded</u> that expanding Medicare eligibility may reduce racial/ethnic health disparities... J.D. Power reported that 51% of retail pharmacy customers have used health/ wellness services during the past year.

430 healthcare groups <u>demanded Congress permanently expand</u> telehealth flexibilities.

# COVID-19 by the Numbers

There have now been <u>over 34.7 million confirmed COVID-19 cases</u> in the US, with a death toll over 612,000... The seven-day <u>average of daily new cases is over 60,000</u>, up 64.1% from last week; cases are up in over 90% of states and territories... A University of Washington model concluded that <u>roughly 1 in 5 Americans have been infected</u> with COVID-19 and that as many of 60% of cases have been unreported... CDC document suggests that the Delta variant causes more severe illness compared to other variants and is <u>as contagious as chickenpox</u>.

344 million COVID-19 <u>vaccine doses have been administered</u> in the US (615,000/day over the past week)... Nearly 190 million Americans (<u>66.9% of Americans 12 and older</u> and 90% of Americans 65 and older) have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine; 163.9 million Americans are fully vaccinated (57.7% of Americans 12 and older).

California and New York City will <u>require state and city employees to be vaccinated</u> or show a weekly negative COVID-19 test... ... The Veterans Affairs Department <u>became the first federal agency to mandate</u> <u>vaccines</u>, requiring 115,000 frontline healthcare workers to be vaccinated.

# Executive and Administrative Action

President Biden announced a <u>requirement that federal employees attest to receiving a COVID-19</u> <u>vaccine</u> or be regularly tested for COVID-19... Biden is encouraging states to <u>give newly vaccinated</u> <u>people a \$100</u> incentive.

The CDC <u>changed guidance</u> to say that fully vaccinated individuals should go back to wearing masks in public indoor settings in areas with high COVID-19 transmission rates; CDC said that <u>69.3% of US</u> <u>counties have transmission rates high enough</u> to justify indoor mask wearing.

The Biden Administration is actively considering recommending a booster COVID-19 vaccine for at least some Americans.

Palantir announced that <u>HHS renewed its contract</u> to support COVID-19 vaccine distribution for another year... The US <u>purchased 200 million more doses</u> of the Pfizer-BioNTech to be delivered from October 2021 to April 2022.

HHS/Justice Department guidance <u>provides COVID long haulers with potential civil rights protections</u> under the American Disabilities Act.

#### Healthcare Law, Business, and Policy News

More than 50 medical and <u>health organizations released a joint statement endorsing mandatory COVID-19 vaccinations</u> for healthcare workers.

The House Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Crisis is <u>broadening its investigation</u> into political interference at the CDC.

A COVID States Project survey found that <u>nearly two-thirds of Americans support</u> federal, state, or local government requirements to get a COVID-19 vaccine... An Axios-Ipsos <u>poll found that unvaccinated</u> <u>individuals</u> who are White, older, and Republican are less likely to consider getting vaccinated than unvaccinated individuals who are Black or Hispanic, younger, and Democrat.

#### Surveillance, Testing, and Treatment

New <u>data show</u> that the efficacy of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine <u>dropped from 96% to 84% after six</u> <u>months</u>; Pfizer plans to submit COVID-19 booster vaccine data to FDA by mid-August... A real world <u>study found that just one dose</u> of the Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, or Oxford-AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine offers higher protection against the Delta variant than indicated in some previously findings.

At the guidance of FDA, Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna <u>will expand the number of young children (age 5</u> to 11) in their pediatric COVID-19 vaccine trials in order to adequately assess possible side effects.

Moderna reported that its <u>COVID-19 vaccine manufacturing partners outside the US are facing delays</u> due to laboratory testing operations.

AstraZeneca plans to <u>seek full approval of its COVID-19 vaccine</u> in the second half of the year, bypassing emergency use authorization... A study concluded that <u>a person's risk of blood clots does not increase</u> after the second Oxford-AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine.

FDA said that Johnson & Johnson's <u>COVID-19 vaccine can now be stored for six months</u>, up from four and a half months.

Emergent BioSolutions announced that <u>FDA gave the company permission to restart COVID-19 vaccine</u> <u>production</u> at its Baltimore plant.

The European Union will <u>purchase up to 220,000 doses</u> of GlaxoSmithKline-Vir Biotechnology's monoclonal antibody for high-risk patients with mild to moderate COVID-19.

Shionogi began <u>a human trial of the first once-a-day pill</u> for treatment of early COVID-19.
