## Healthcare regulatory news

CMS <u>extended</u> the 2022 ACA <u>open enrollment period by a month</u> (<u>through January 15</u>) and expanded navigator services.

CDC is investing \$2.1B in healthcare-setting infection prevention/control... HRSA awarded \$350M to support maternal and child health... CMS awarded \$15M to 20 states to expand Medicaid community-based mobile crisis intervention services... ONC awarded \$73M to 10 colleges/universities to expand the diversity of the public health IT workforce.

FDA released a <u>commitment letter for the third iteration of the Biosimilar User Fee</u> Amendments program... FDA approved the <u>first biosimilar to Roche's Lucentis</u>.

HRSA <u>referred six pharmaceutical manufacturers</u> to the OIG for failing to comply with 340B program statutory obligations... <u>OIG found that 20 health insurers</u> drove a <u>"disproportionate" share</u> of the \$9.2 billion in 2017 Medicare Advantage payments from diagnoses reported only on chart reviews and health-risk assessments... OIG recommended states improve oversight of telehealth for behavioral health.





## Healthcare law and policy news

Department of Justice charged 138 individuals with involvement in \$1.4B in telemedicine-related fraud.

A <u>federal district court ruled</u> that the FDA's <u>drug compounding MOU</u> violates the law and cannot be enforced.

Ohio reached <u>a \$808 million settlement</u> with Cardinal Health, AmerisourceBergen, and McKesson over their role in the opioid epidemic... Centene and Humana <u>separately sued Merck for alleged</u> pay-for-delay tactics.

HCA will purchase five Steward hospitals in Utah... Walgreens paid \$970M to increase ownership stake in Shields Health Solutions... Boehringer Ingelheim acquired Abexxa Biologics... Humana is rumored to be considering acquiring Centene... Boston Scientific plans to acquire Devoro (\$336)... The European Commission intends to intervene to block Illumina's acquisition of Grail.

Apple is developing iPhone features to diagnose depression and cognitive decline.

A JAMA study found inpatient mortality rates for acute myocardial infarction decreased from 9.4% to 5% after rural hospitals were acquired by a larger health system... AMA reported a 44.4% decrease in opioid prescribing over the past decade... KFF found Medicare beneficiaries paid an average of \$914, \$874, and \$230 out-of-pocket for hearing, dental, and vision services, respectively, in 2018... An AHAcommissioned report estimated hospitals could lose \$54B this year due to greater expenses and sicker patients... An NIH study found methamphetamine overdoses deaths nearly tripled from 2015 to 2019.
