## Healthcare regulatory news

An IRS <u>proposed rule</u> specifies that Medicaid coverage limited to COVID-19 testing and diagnostic services provided under the Families First Coronavirus Response Act does meet the definition of ACA "minimum essential coverage."

FDA approved the first <u>treatment for the most common cause of</u> dwarfism.





## Healthcare law and policy news

The House <u>passed the Democrats' \$1.7T social spending bill</u>, which <u>includes several</u> <u>healthcare provisions</u>; passage by the Senate is uncertain.

A *JAMA* study found <u>uneven performance by states on ensuring access</u> to opioid use disorder treatment during the pandemic.

Bain and Hellman & Friedman <u>acquired Athenahealth</u> (\$17B)... Bain Capital <u>purchased a majority stake in InnovaCare</u>... A pair of European investment groups are <u>considering a joint offer to purchase Novartis'</u> <u>generics business</u>, Sandoz.



#### **COVID-19 News**

Following FDA authorization, CDC <u>expanded eligibility for COVID-19</u> <u>booster doses of Pfizer-BioNTech's and Moderna's vaccines to all adults age 18</u> and older at least six months after receiving a second dose.

Pfizer and BioNTech reported that their <u>COVID-19 vaccine was 100%</u> <u>effective at preventing infections in adolescents ages 12 to 15</u> within four months of a second dose, with no serious safety concerns after six months.

The White House reported that over 90% of federal employees have received a COVID-19 vaccine dose; as a result of approved exceptions, 95% are compliant with the Administration's vaccine requirements.

Vice President Kamala Harris <u>announced \$1.5B in federal funding</u> to address health workforce equity during and after the pandemic.

Two-thirds of Americans plan to <u>celebrate Thanksgiving with friends/family</u> <u>outside of their immediate household</u>, regardless of vaccination status.

Anthony Fauci, the President's Chief Medical Advisor, said that <u>fully</u> <u>vaccinated families do not need to wear masks</u> during holiday celebrations.
