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CMS released: (1) a <u>final rule to implement sections of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021</u>, authorizing HHS to establish special enrollment periods; (2) <u>CY 2023 Medicare Physician Fee</u> <u>Schedule Final Rule</u>, that decreased the PFS conversion factor by \$1.55, extended several Medicare telehealth PHE flexibilities through 2023, and overhauled the Medicare Shared Savings Program; (3) <u>CY 2023 Medicare Hospital Outpatient Prospective Payment System and Ambulatory</u> <u>Surgical Center Payment System Final Rule with comment period</u>, that introduced measures to improve behavioral health access; (4) <u>CY 2023 End-Stage Renal Disease Prospective Payment</u> <u>System Final Rule</u>; (5) <u>CY 2023 Home Health Prospective Payment System Rate Update and</u> <u>Home Infusion Therapy Services Requirements Final Rule</u>.

<u>OIG released an updated report on 12 previous hospital compliance audits; in written comments,</u> CMS reported collecting 91% of the sustained amount of OIG-identified overpayments. <u>Marketplace Open Enrollment began this week</u> with four out of five consumers eligible for coverage for \$10 or less per month after tax credits.



Healthcare law and policy news

The Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) partnered with the National Security Council to issue an <u>RFI on its Data Collection for Emergency Clinical Trials and Interoperability Pilot</u>.

The <u>Senate Finance Committee urged CMS to address deceptive marketing practices</u> by Medicare Advantage plans.

<u>Kaiser Family Foundation released an updated issue brief</u> examining factors contributing to maternal and infant health disparities.

<u>McKinsey agreed to settle hundreds of claims by U.S. local governments and school districts</u> that it fueled an epidemic of opioid addiction... <u>CVS</u> and <u>Walgreens</u> tentatively agreed to pay \$5B each to settle lawsuits brought by states and local governments alleging mishandling opioid prescriptions; <u>Walmart tentatively agreed</u> to pay \$3B to settle similar lawsuits.

New studies found: (1) the first 8 months of the COVID-19 pandemic were associated with worsening blood pressure among individuals with hypertension; (2) one in eight deaths of working age adults were attributable to excessive alcohol consumption.

<u>Johnson & Johnson acquired Abiomed</u> for \$16.6B... <u>Google acquired Sound Life Sciences</u>, a startup with an application to detect respiratory problems... <u>Carta Healthcare, a clinical data</u> <u>company, raised \$20M</u> in series B funding... <u>Lusaris Therapeutics raised \$60M</u> in series A funding to address treatment-resistant depression.

Special Section: COVID-19 and Monkeypox News

A study found a greater risk of long COVID is associated with female gender and older age.

The <u>Supreme Court upheld a ruling, Corbett v. TSA et al.</u>, from the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit <u>allowing TSA to require mask-wearing on planes</u>, trains, and other forms of transit.

<u>Pfizer and BioNTech launched a Phase 1 trial</u> for a vaccine that would target COVID-19 and influenza.

<u>New Pfizer data from a Phase 2/3 clinical trial showed</u> that its updated omicron-targeting COVID-19 booster increased antibodies for adults 55 and older four-fold in comparison to an extra dose of the original vaccine.

HHS renewed the national public health emergency for the monkeypox outbreak.

The seven-day average of reported U.S. monkeypox cases hit 29 cases on November 2nd.

A study found that <u>the U.S. public health workforce needs 80,000 more full-time workers</u> to fully implement core Foundational Public Health Services.
