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CMS proposed 2024 MA and Part D changes, including revised marketing and prior authorization requirements, a health equity index star-ratings' reward, and improved behavioral health access.

CMS <u>proposed</u> 2024 <u>ACA marketplace changes</u>, including stricter network adequacy standards, limiting non-standard plans, and an SEP for Medicaid/CHIP coverage loss ... IRS <u>extended</u> the time for employers to provide individual annual statements regarding ACA minimum essential coverage.

CMS <u>approved Washington's 1332 waiver</u> allowing undocumented residents to purchase 2024 ACA exchange plans.

CMS <u>delayed an updated draft coverage determination</u> for amyloid PET scans for Alzheimer's detection.

SAMHSA <u>proposed permanently loosening restrictions</u> on take-home opioid addiction treatments, including allowing prescribing via telehealth.

AHRQ is seeking comment on <u>advancing patient and healthcare workforce safety</u> and evidence/data on health-system-level strategies to <u>address racial/ethnic/socioeconomic health</u> <u>disparities.</u>

FDA <u>granted accelerated approval</u> to a KRAS-blocking treatment for an advanced form of lung cancer.

OSTP <u>announced \$1.2B in work/investment</u> to promote involvement of women, people of color, and other underrepresented groups in STEMM.

HHS OIG and DOJ will partner on addressing anticompetitive behaviors in healthcare.



Healthcare law and policy news

CMS' Actuaries reported <u>US healthcare spending increased 2.7% to \$4.3B in 2021</u>, down from 10.3% in 2021... SSR Health data show <u>brand-name drug wholesale prices increased 4.8% in Q3</u>; net prices fell 0.3%.

University of Michigan Health <u>plans to acquire Sparrow Health</u>... Amgen <u>agreed to acquire Horizon</u> <u>Therapeutics</u> (\$27.8B)... SCAN and CareOregon <u>plan to merge</u> into a \$6.8B company... Takeda will <u>pay Nimbus Therapeutics (\$6B)</u> for an experimental autoimmune disease... Clovis Oncology <u>filed</u> <u>for bankruptcy</u>... An Illinois review board <u>approved Deaconess' acquisition of four Quorum</u> <u>hospitals</u>... BCBSMA <u>announced four value-based contracts</u> incentivizing health equity improvements.

CVS and Walgreens <u>will pay \$10.7B to settle multistate opioid epidemic-related lawsuits</u>... Labor unions <u>sued Elevance</u> for <u>restricting access to claims data</u> and failing to pass through discounts.

Abbvie is leaving PhRMA and BIO.

A <u>STAT-The Markup investigation</u> found dozens of direct-to-consumer telehealth companies shared sensitive health data with big tech companies... Epic will <u>shut down its app market</u>, replacing it with a <u>vendor directory</u> to self-report interoperability with Epic's API.

Moody's <u>reported healthcare company credit downgrades</u> are increasing; STAT reported <u>90% of</u> <u>financially stressed companies</u> are owned by private equity.

Special Section: COVID-19, Respiratory Illnesses, and Monkeypox News

CDC formally recommended bivalent COVID-19 vaccines for children as young as 6 months.

HHS Secretary <u>Xavier Becerra told state governors</u> that waivers intended for the COVID-19 PHE (e.g., expanded telehealth, patient screening/triage off-site, etc.) can be used to address surges in RSV and influenza, as long as COVID-19 continues to contribute to challenges in responding to other respiratory illnesses.

The federal government reopened its program for free at-home COVID-19 tests for all households.

The Biden Administration will pay Pfizer \$2B for 3.7M additional courses of Paxlovid.

FDA granted fast track designation to Pfizer-BioNTech's single-dose combination mRNA vaccine for COVID-19 and influenza.

A <u>CDC analysis found 3,544 Americans died</u>, at least in part, due to long COVID from January 2020 through June 2022... Commonwealth Fund <u>estimated COVID-19 vaccinations from December 2020</u> to <u>November 2022</u> prevented at least 18.5M additional hospitalizations and 3.2 million additional deaths in the US... A <u>KFF analysis found</u> just 45% of all nursing home residents and 22% of nursing home staff are up to date on their COVID-19 vaccinations.

The House Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Crisis <u>released its final report</u>, which concluded "pre-existing vulnerabilities, failures in leadership and program implementation, and predatory actions by private actors" contributed to a poor initial response to the pandemic; the committee <u>issued 30 recommendations</u> to "strengthen the nation's ability to prevent and respond to public health and economic emergencies"... House Intelligence Committee <u>Democrats</u> and <u>Republicans</u> issued separate reports on the US intelligence community's response to COVID-19.
