Healthcare regulatory news

CMS will increase FY2024 payments for <u>acute-care hospitals 3.1% (\$2.2B</u>), <u>skilled nursing facilities 4.0% (\$1.4B</u>), and <u>hospice 3.1% (\$780M)</u>... CMS projected <u>average monthly Medicare Part D premiums will decrease 1.8%</u> in 2024 to \$55.50.

CMS Innovation Center announced the <u>Guiding an Improved Dementia</u> <u>Experience (GUIDE) Model</u>, an 8-year voluntary model to <u>improve quality of life for Medicare beneficiaries with dementia</u> and reduce burden/strain on unpaid caregivers.

CMS and contractor Maximus <u>notified 612,000 Medicare beneficiaries of a</u> data breach.

FDA <u>approved the second over-the-counter naloxone spray</u>, manufactured by <u>the nonprofit Harm Reduction Therapeutics</u>... OMB is reviewing a <u>proposed rule asserting FDA authority to regulate</u> laboratory developed tests as medical devices.

CDC's ACIP <u>recommended use of a monoclonal antibody</u> to prevent RSV in infants/high-risk toddlers... USPSTF may <u>recommend COVID-19</u> <u>screening</u> for coverage without cost-sharing.

HHS <u>launched</u> the Office of Long COVID Research and Practice and NIH long COVID clinical trials... NIH <u>appointed Jeanne Marrazzo</u> as the next Director of NIAID.

Labor Department <u>sued UnitedHealth Group</u> for allegedly denying thousands of emergency department and drug screening claims.

CDC data show the uninsured rate reached an all-time low (7.7%) in Q1 2023... CMS data show 715,000 individuals lost Medicaid coverage in April, 80% due to procedural reasons; KFF reports 3.8M have lost coverage since redeterminations began.

Biogen will acquire Reata (\$7.3B)... AstraZeneca purchased early-stage rare disease gene therapies from Pfizer... Microsoft announced a five-year partnership with Duke Health to advance AI in medicine... Amazon is expanding its virtual clinical service, Amazon Clinic, nationwide.

A <u>JAMA</u> study found obesity/diabetes GLP-1 drugs manufacturers secured a median of 19.5 patents/product, extending exclusivity to 18.3 years... A <u>USC Schaeffer Center study projected</u> Medicare coverage of weight-loss therapies would save Medicare \$175-245B, depending on private insurance coverage... An Elevance Health <u>study found following a health system acquisition of independent hospitals</u>, prices for commercially insured patients increased 5% and hospital readmissions for cardiac care patients increased 10-12%... March of Dimes <u>classified 36% of counties as "maternity care deserts" in 2022</u>, up 2% from 2020... An <u>Urban Institute study found</u> 22% of Black parents reported being treated/judged unfairly in healthcare settings in the past year, compared to 13% of parents overall.
