Healthcare regulatory news

FDA approved (1) <u>Pfizer's vaccine for pregnant individuals</u> to prevent RSV in infants; and (2) the <u>first biosimilar to treat multiple sclerosis</u>.

CMS issued <u>guidance</u> on the Medicare Prescription Payment Plan, allowing <u>Part D beneficiaries to spread cost sharing over the year</u> through capped monthly payments.

CMS reported MSSP ACOs saved Medicare \$1.8B compared to benchmarks in 2022.

CMS <u>outlined actions to address hospice benefit integrity issues</u>, including possible administrative action against nearly 400 hospices.

CMS <u>determined that coverage</u> under the National Coverage Determination for anti-amyloid monoclonal antibody Alzheimer's treatments does not meet the "significant cost" threshold and Medicare Advantage plans and others must assume the costs based on coverage criteria.

ARPA-H <u>launched a project on mRNA technologies</u> to fight cancer and other diseases.

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Healthcare law and policy news

Boehringer Ingelheim <u>sued</u> to <u>block implementation</u> of the Medicare Drug Price Negotiation Program... STAT reported <u>drug manufacturers increased</u> (<u>median of 3.4%</u>) <u>wholesale prices of 123 drugs</u> on July 1, the most midyear increases since 2013.

<u>Teva</u> and <u>Glenmark</u> will pay \$225M and \$30M, respectively, <u>through</u> deferred prosecution agreements to resolve criminal price-fixing charges.

CVS <u>launched Cordavis</u> to commercialize and/or co-produce biosimilars... Oak Street and Strive Health <u>announced a multiyear kidney care</u> collaboration... Cigna <u>removed 25% of medical services (600+ codes)</u> from prior authorization... Epic <u>announced a "showroom" for third-party vendor programs</u> to replace its app market.

An <u>HSR study found</u> low-income Medicare beneficiaries and patients of color are more likely than white and high-income patients to be discharged from home health without functional improvements... CDC <u>reported 20% of women experienced</u> mistreatment while receiving maternity care.

USPSTF <u>updated its HIV preexposure prophylaxis (PrEP) coverage recommendation</u> to include <u>a long-acting injectable</u> form.

A KFF poll found 34% of US adults "definitely" or "probably" believe the false claim that COVID-19 vaccines have caused thousands of sudden deaths in otherwise healthy people.

A <u>Business Group on Health survey of large employers found</u> 77% reported increased workforce mental health needs, up from 44% last year; and 64% thought virtual care would transform care delivery, down from 85% in 2021... Third Way <u>reported 23.5% of middle-income Americans</u> (\$50,000-\$100,000/year) have unpaid medical bills, more than lower income (22%) and higher income (12.9%) individuals.

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
