Healthcare regulatory news

CMS issued a <u>final rule</u> to <u>streamline Medicare Savings Program enrollment</u>... CMS/IRS/Labor <u>proposed revised fees</u> for filing arbitration cases under the *No Surprises Act*; CMS <u>instructed independent dispute resolution entities to resume processing</u> certain disputes.

HHS <u>reported nearly 500,000 individuals</u> were <u>improperly disenrolled</u> <u>from Medicaid/CHIP</u> during coverage redeterminations.

FDA approved <u>a GSK blood cancer treatment</u> and <u>declined to approve</u> the first epinephrine nasal spray... FDA <u>issued draft guidance</u> to revise labeling practices for biosimilar and interchangeable products.



Healthcare law and policy news

HHS <u>awarded \$600M to increase COVID-19 test manufacturing/supply</u> and relaunched COVIDTests.gov to deliver free tests to households.

FTC <u>sued U.S. Anesthesia Partners and its private equity</u> supporter for allegedly scheming to monopolize the anesthesiology market in Texas.

Boston Scientific <u>agreed to acquire Relievant Medsystems</u> (\$850M)... Mallinckrodt <u>is considering selling</u> its opioid business... Oracle Health <u>announced integration of a voice-enabled generative AI digital assistant</u> into its Millennium EHR... Select Health, an Intermountain subsidiary, <u>will become one of the first health plans offering member access</u> to Mark Cuban Cost Plus Drug Company products/services... A group of PBMs <u>launched an advocacy coalition</u> to support PBM legislative reforms.

A <u>Commonwealth Fund survey found 19% of Medicare beneficiaries</u> age 65+ were underinsured in 2022 and 23% reported challenges affording their premiums... A <u>KFF analysis found 19% of nursing facilities</u> would meet hours per resident day requirements of CMS' nurse staffing requirements proposed rule.

A <u>BMJ</u> study found nurse practitioners and physician assistants delivered 25.6% of US healthcare visits in December 2019, up from 14% in January 2013... A <u>JAMA study found</u> total medical expenditures (out-of-pocket costs and public insurance coverage) of low-income, immigrant, working-age adults (\$3,800/person/year) are less than half the corresponding expenditures of similar US-born adults (\$9,428)... A <u>JAMA study found</u> little correlation between hospitals' self-posted online prices and prices offered by telephone to secret shoppers... A <u>Pediatrics</u> study found ADHD medication errors nearly tripled 2000 to 2021, likely attributable to increased prescribing.

USPSTF <u>recommended</u> pregnant women be <u>screened for hypertensive</u> disorders at every prenatal visit.

Senate HELP Committee <u>advanced</u> a \$26B <u>primary care and workforce</u> <u>bill</u>... The House <u>abandoned plans to vote</u> on the <u>Lower Costs, More</u> <u>Transparency Act</u> this week under suspension of the rules.
