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Healthcare regulatory news

HHS/Labor/Treasury <u>reopened</u> the No Surprises Act <u>independent dispute</u> resolution portal.

A <u>CMS final rule specifies</u> how/when it will calculate and impose civil monetary penalties for Medicare secondary payers that fail to meet federal reporting requirements.

CMS <u>announced the 2024 standard monthly Medicare Part B premium</u> will be \$174.70, up \$9.80 (6%) from 2023.

FDA is <u>forming an advisory committee</u> to support <u>regulation of digital health</u> <u>technologies</u>, including AI, augmented/virtual reality, digital therapeutics, and wearables.

DEA <u>further extended</u> pandemic rules for telehealth prescribing of controlled <u>substances through the end of 2024</u> while it considers a permanent policy change.

HHS <u>OIG reported Aetna Medicare Advantage</u> plans received \$25M+ in overpayments in 2015/2016.

HHS reported more than 7M Americans have received the updated COVID-19 vaccine.

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Healthcare law and policy news

Bristol-Myers Squibb finalized plans to acquire Mirati Therapeutics (\$4.8B)... Cigna's Evernorth acquired Bright.md to enhance its MDLIVE virtual care platform... Blue Cross Michigan finalized its affiliation with Blue Cross Vermont... Presbyterian Healthcare and UnityPoint Health called off their merger... EU ordered Illumina to unwind its \$7B acquisition of Grail... General Catalyst announced a new company to support partners with healthcare industry transformation, with plans to acquire a health system in its first year... Sanofi and BioMap will collaborate to co-develop AI modules for biotherapeutic drug discovery.

Google announced <u>a generative AI search function</u> for clinical settings... Microsoft <u>announced several healthcare data and AI</u> initiatives... Best Buy will <u>sell a prescription-based medical device</u>, Dexcom G7 continuous glucose monitor... Walgreens is launching <u>an on-demand virtual care service</u> this month... Walmart is <u>expanding virtual primary care</u> to about <u>1M employee health plan members</u>.

HITRUST <u>announced launch</u> of an <u>AI Assurance Program</u> to support secure and sustainable use of AI technology... 13 health systems <u>signed</u> <u>an interoperability pact</u> with the VA.

JAMA studies found: (1) providers at two hospitals between 2018 and 2020 were more likely to view/engage with EHR records of White patients than those of other races/ethnicities; (2) approximately 20% of adolescents had major depressive disorder in 2021, with varied prevalence across racial and ethnic groups; less than half of adolescents needing mental health treatment received treatment; and (3) depressive symptoms in adults were positively associated with cardiovascular disease mortality.

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
