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Healthcare regulatory news

CMS <u>finalized a rule</u> requiring nursing homes to <u>disclose information about</u> <u>their ownership structure</u>.

HHS proposed 2025 ACA marketplace policies, including network adequacy requirements for state-based exchanges.

CMS <u>approved Missouri as the 40th state</u> to expand Medicaid postpartum coverage to 12 months.

HHS released an <u>HHS Language Access Plan</u> to <u>address language</u> <u>barriers</u> in accessing healthcare and human services.



Healthcare law and policy news

Congress passed, and President Biden signed, a two-step continuing resolution to provide federal government funding through early next year; it also extends some expired health programs and delays DSH cuts.

The White House <u>launched an initiative</u> to advance women's health research.

UnitedHealth Group is <u>facing a class-action lawsuit</u> for <u>allegedly using AI to</u> <u>improperly deny</u> post-acute care coverage to Medicare Advantage enrollees.

Thoma Bravo <u>completed its \$1.8B acquisition</u> of NextGen Healthcare... Surescripts is <u>applying to become a qualified health information network</u> under HHS' Trusted Exchange Framework and Common Agreement... OptumRx is <u>moving eight popular insulin products</u> to preferred status on its standard formulary... Express Scripts <u>announced a ClearNetwork</u> <u>pharmacy option</u> for clients to pay "straight-forward estimated" acquisition costs for drugs, plus a small markup for dispensing/service costs... Novo Nordisk <u>reported</u> its obesity drug Wegovy <u>reduced the risk</u> of cardiovascular death, nonfatal heart attacks, and nonfatal strokes, in addition to weight loss benefits.

A <u>JAMA study found</u> the US life expectancy fell from 78.8 years in 2019 to 76.1 years in 2021, with the largest gap between men (73.2) and women (79.1) since 1996... The <u>2022 National Survey on Drug Use and Health</u> found <u>48.7M people in the US age 12+ (17.3%)</u> had a substance use disorder in 2022, up from <u>46.3M in 2021</u>... KFF projected, based on a state officials survey, that <u>Medicare enrollment will drop 8.6% in FY24</u>, while total program spending increases 3.4% and state spending increases 17.2%... March of Dimes reported US <u>preterm birth rates remain "alarmingly high,"</u> with persistent racial disparities on infant/maternal health indicators... An <u>MGMA survey</u> found prior authorization is the top regulatory burden for group practices.

House Energy and Commerce Health Committee <u>advanced 21 healthcare</u> <u>bills</u>, including on <u>PBM oversight</u>, adjusting Medicare payment for DME, expanding access to biosimilars, and extending Advanced APM bonuses.

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
