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Healthcare regulatory news

A CMS <u>memo</u> to MA plans clarified acceptable Al algorithm use in medical necessity determinations; Al algorithms alone are not compliant with federal regulation... The Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT (ONC) filed <u>a correction to a proposed Al rule</u> in a bid to avoid delaying implementation of Al transparency regulations.

<u>CMS approved</u> New Mexico's State Plan Amendment (SPA) expanding <u>access to community-based mobile crisis intervention services</u> authorized by the American Rescue Plan... The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) <u>announced \$28M in funding</u> to expand substance use disorder treatment services among pregnant and postpartum women.





Healthcare law and policy news

UCSF Health to <u>acquire two community hospitals</u> from Dignity Health; St. Mary's Medicaid Center and Saint Francis Memorial Hospital (\$100M)... Novo Holdings (Novo Nordisk's parent company) to <u>acquire Catalent</u> to expand production of its anti-obesity drug, Wegovy (\$16.5B)... Valuebased primary care provider Cano Health <u>filed for bankruptcy</u> after incurring nearly \$1B debt.

Johnson & Johnson is facing a class-action <u>lawsuit</u> for alleged mismanagement of employee health benefits; the suit claims J&J failed to negotiate lower prescription drug prices, resulting in millions in overpayments for generics.

Georgia is suing CMS after it denied the state's 1115 waiver extension for partial Medicaid expansion; GA's initial waiver was delayed due to a lawsuit over its work requirements... Florida is suing CMS for an exemption to the 12-month continuous coverage requirement for children; the suit claims it conflates eligibility and enrollment, violating the Administrative Procedures Act.

Pennsylvania Governor announced a plan to <u>cancel \$400M in medical debt</u> for state residents.

Medicaid enrollment decreased by nearly 10M from a record high (94M enrollees) in April 2023 according to a KFF Tracker... A Health Affairs study found Tennessee Medicaid disenrollment led to a roughly 28% increase in eviction filings from 2005-2009 relative to other southern states.

A <u>survey of rural health providers</u> found 91% of respondents were optimistic about their financial viability; 40% rated their financial stability higher than last year and 70% plan to expand existing service lines.

Three *Health Services Research and Managerial Epidemiology* studies on the potential harm of medication abortion <u>were retracted</u>, citing the authors' conflict of interest and misleading data.





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
